**Universe:** Adults resident in GB

**Methodology:** Online

**Sample size:** 1224

**Fieldwork dates:** 26 May - 01 June 2017

**Weighting:** All the results were weighted by age, sex, region and SEG and voters were also weighted to match the 2015 UK election and 2016 EU referendum results. For Westminster voting intention, age groups were weighted to match the 2015 BES voter profile and locations have been weighted to match the turnout of voters based on stats from the Electoral Commission. Respondents who didn't state a preference for a party have been pressed for an answer and added to those who did. Reported figures include only people who say they are certain to vote (10/10).
